## Training Compliance Checklist

Structured training program for both QEW and UEW  - Establish clear objectives  - Tie training to job descriptions  - Review and evaluate program annually  Training should be focused on the risks associated with the job and the knowledge to perform the job successfully and safely
Well-written, clearly defined job description that identifies the job as subject to the associated OSHA requirements (this could include regulations beyond those covered in this training)  - Develop parameters - Set expectations
<ul> <li>Knowledge assessments (quiz)</li> <li>Show understanding of concepts</li> <li>Establish passing score for competency</li> </ul>
Skill assessment (performance demonstration)  - Demonstrate mastery of skills  - Establish understanding of safety requirements
Training that addresses electrical and electrical equipment risks  - Train workers on expectations and requirements  - Follow industry standard for refresher training  - Supplement and strengthen your training program with external resources
Periodic performance evaluation for higher risk tasks, particularly those not performed regularly  - Ensure retention of competency and skills
Centralized training tracking  - Manage documentation  - Record completed training  - Evaluate training program effectiveness
